Anime, manga, games, pop music, fashion, food ... nowadays youth culture is quickly developing as a common Asian culture, breaking through the language barriers and raising youth with deep values and sensitivities.

In Fukuoka Prefecture, cultivating youth cultural exchange is seen as an important measure in considering next-generation exchanges with Asia. Since 2005, we have been operating the multilingual website "asianbeat", which shares information about youth culture with the world. Through information about exchanges and events, we are striving to promote mutual understanding amongst youth in Asia.

With the rapid progress of multiculturalism in Fukuoka, the Fukuoka International Exchange Foundation offers the necessary information and resources for teaching international understanding. In order to cultivate local communities that strive to increase multicultural understanding through exchange, many initiatives are under way within the prefecture.

This time, we focus on the things experienced and gained by a foreign guest teacher through international exchange at a school in Fukuoka Prefecture.

<Objective>

To broaden students' interest in different cultures through interaction and presenting their research of Korean culture.

The students' research presentation...

From 1st to 3rd year students, each class presented the findings of their study. The three year groups tackled one theme each - tourist spots, traditional dress and sports, and food.

The presentation was full of variety, with a multiple-choice quiz about Korean table manners, the top 5 Korean foods chosen by Japanese travelers, as well as life-size cutouts of traditional dress - Baji-Jeogori (male) and Chima-Jeogori (female). Even guest teacher Kim looked on with great interest.

Ms Kim's presentation - Korean culture and lifestyle

Hearing about Korean dress, weddings and funerals, and New Year's foods directly from Ms Kim was very different from the research the students had done. Ms Kim introduced not only traditional culture but also about modern Korea. Everyone danced along to a video of a popular Korean dance, and made Korean towel sheep which are worn as hats in the sauna...

With many similarities between the two countries, Korea suddenly seemed much closer to home
